"There is no version of primeval history, preceding the discoveries of modern science, that is as rational and as inspiring as that of the Book of Genesis," Asimov says. However, human knowledge does increase, and if the biblical writers "had written those early chapters of Genesis knowing what we know today, we can be certain that they would have written it completely differently." Isaac Asimov brings to this fascinating subject his wide-ranging knowledge of science and history-- and his award-winning ability to explain the complex with accuracy, clarity, and wit.
