Film Nation-Robert Burgoyne 1997 Explores contemporary American films that challenge official history. Our movies have started talking back to us, and Film Nation takes a close look at what they have to say. In movies like JFK and Forrest Gump, Robert Burgoyne sees a filmic extension of the debates that exercise us as a nation -- debates about race and culture and

national identity, about the nature and makeup of American history. In analyses of five films that challenge the traditional myths of the nation-state -- *Glory*, *Thunderheart*, *JFK*, *Born on the Fourth of July*, and *Forrest Gump* -- Burgoyne explores the reshaping of our collective imaginary in relation to our history.
